Dear Parents,

Thank you for all your support in making this a wonderful start to the school year. Although the students returned to class only a few weeks ago, activities designed to introduce and acclimate students and families to middle school began mid August. We hosted our annual, and very well attended, "Technology" workshop and "Open House/Locker Orientation". A big thank you to our PTO and the Monroe Youth Commission for sponsoring an "Ice Cream Social" on the day of our "Open House".

Every year, we set goals for the Jockey Hollow community. Along with our academic goals this year, we have set a goal of promoting kindness and safe, appropriate online social skills for the students. Three strategies we will use to address kindness online use and a heightened awareness of the dangers of negative conversations online use will be activity based lessons for students delivered through our "Lion's Den" advisory meetings, our PBIS "Positive Behavior Support" and sharing safe social media use information with parents through resources like "Coffee with the Principal".

Our "Lion's Den" advisory meetings are a regular meeting time in the school day where a teacher and a small group of students meet to discuss various social-emotional and interpersonal topics. The mission of the advisory program at Jockey Hollow School is to connect students to an adult advocate, to connect students to other students, and to connect students to their school.

According to the National Middle School Association (2006), "In the best (advisory) programs, young adolescents have an opportunity to get to know one adult really well, to find a point of security in the institution, and to learn about what it means to be a healthy human being". Further research cited by the NMSA documents improvement in students' decision making, sense of belonging to school, and in teacher-student relations, when a regular advisor/advise program is implemented.

All Jockey Hollow students will meet in an Advisory Group. Students and staff will meet once a month for 30 minutes. There is no grade for advisory. Student participation is the goal and will be assessed by the teacher/advisor. It is the model we will use to develop instruction on "Safe and Appropriate Online Use".

The new school year brings changes and revisions to procedures and policies followed by our schools. The district homework policy has been revised. The new policy includes teacher, student and parent responsibilities regarding homework. It also contains "Suggested Time Guidelines" for homework as well as designated "Home Work-Free Periods". The entire policy can be found in our student handbook on the Jockey Hollow web page at www.monroeps.org. At Jockey Hollow, we have revised our criteria for students to earn "Honor Roll" and/or "High Honor Roll" status. The criteria reads, "To qualify for high honors, a student must earn a 90% average or higher with no grade less than a B. To qualify for honors, a student must earn an 83% average or higher with no grade lower than a C+. "There will be no weighting of grades to determine high honors or honors. The entire criteria statement can be found in our student handbook on the Jockey Hollow web page at www.monroeps.org.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at our annual "Back to School Night". Your support is so important in our working together to provide the best possible education for children. Your compliments shared that evening and during the days that followed are much appreciated by the staff and me. It assures us that you find the information shared during the presentations valuable in assisting you as we start a new school year.

Today marks the mid point of our first quarter. This is an ideal time to review your child's grades on Power-School. Please use this report as a positive means to address their successes and growth as well as goals they would like to set for themselves to improve. Should you have questions regarding your child's progress, please contact your child's teacher or team to discuss your concerns. If you need assistance with PowerSchool, contact the Main Office.

May I extend my appreciation for the support I have received from the entire Jockey Hollow community throughout the opening of this school year. It is our working together that ensures the success of each student.
